

The main aim of AIIC is to encourage the young leaders of the next level of aquaculture to ignite their innovative thoughts, addressing the real-world challenges in aquaculture. AIIC provides an international forum to interact with peers and network with prospective investors who could nurture those promising ideas to full-blown business proposals too!



The top 3 winning ideas per category will be featured on the WAS website and social media.

A Certificate of Commendation will be issued to the top 3 winners per category in addition to the opportunity to serve as a moderator in the next WAS-APC student webinar.

Think of any aquatic organism and submit one best idea on innovation or technology that has the potential to drive the future of sustainable intensification of aquaculture related to either land-based or coastal farming.

### Include in your submission the following:

- -Current aquaculture farming approaches and production in your country or region
- -Aquaculture issues faced in meeting production targets
- -What are the gaps existing in the current production models
- -Innovation, technologies, and approaches for addressing production issues whilst taking environmental, economic, and social sustainability into consideration
- -The extent of the potential of your innovation to be widely adopted or upscaled

#### **Details of submission:**

- -A 20-minute PowerPoint presentation deck (maximum of 15 slides) using Calibri Body of font size between 20 24 to Ms Nate, WAS-APC Secretariat, at apcsec@was.org by **1 November 2021.**
- -Only one submission is allowed per participant with the PowerPoint presentation together with a 500-word summary of the innovative project is allowed for either land-based or coastal aquaculture.
- -Indicate your name, institution, country, and a scanned supporting letter with your institution logo from your department head/lecturer/research supervisor, whose email address would need to be reflected in the letter.

### **Details of the competition:**

- -5 shortlisted submissions per category from the first screening will be advanced to the next stage, where the presentation would be made at a live webinar, date to be announced.
- -The webinar attendees will vote on the top 3 presentations per category based on criteria set by the AIIC Committee comprising academicians, researchers, and industry players from WAS-APC and AIC.
- -The presentations will be recorded, and these will be shared on WAS-APC website and its social media. Participants with shortlisted submissions would be given a certificate of participation.
