The team has grown to 16 full-time members spread across the globe, who run the three business units of Hatch – our accelerator program, our fund and our innovation services.

About Aquaculture Innovation Centre

Aquaculture Innovation Centre (AIC) is the youngest Centre of Innovation funded and established by Enterprise Singapore to serve the needs of the local aquaculture industry. The national centre adopts an inclusive and collaborative approach involving universities and polytechnics to ensure a sustainable partnership. The collaborative model allows AIC to tap on shared expertise, facilities and equipment to provide the best fit solution for addressing the needs of the aquaculture industry.
