Security Operations in International Events

BERTRUM Leong Zhao De

CERTIFICATE IN SECURITY OPERATIONS

In less than half a year into this industry, 23-year-old Bertrum Leong Zhao De has been involved in security duties with the inaugural Youth Olympic Games (YOG), the Formula One Singtel Singapore Grand Prix and ZoukOut 2010.

He enrolled in the Security Industry Institute (SII) to gain the necessary qualifications for him to function as a security officer, and has since obtained full qualification in Certificate in Security Operations and Advanced Certificate in Security Supervision.

It was in SII where Leong bagged his first big break in the industry. During his course in the Certificate in Security Operations, security agencies were looking for manpower for YOG duty, a call he responded.

He was stationed at the Nanyang Technological University Sports Hall from a week before the start of the Games to its conclusion. His main assignment was to ensure the safety of the youth athletes and their belongings as they went about their training sessions.

The SII trainer teaches me the basic theory knowledge that is essential for me before I am sent out for assignment.

For one who has no prior experience in security before his YOG involvement, the SII modules were very beneficial as Leong applied what he had learnt at his stations of duty.

He mentioned one particular area in his course which aided him in discharging his work well, whether it was in his regular weekend duties or during the major events.

"The trainer used the role play training method to prepare and pre-empt me in potential situations and they are useful and relevant to the work I have been involved in since."

It has not only helped the student communicate effectively with locals and foreigners during his YOG stint, but also during the Formula One night race and ZoukOut.

For the Singapore Grand Prix, he was stationed at the express lane security clearance at Gate 7, which was located near Marina Square.

He had to conduct body checks on guests who carried heavy load, and with his team, do thorough security sweeps in their zone hours before the crowds appeared.

At the recent ZoukOut in Sentosa, he and his colleagues were stationed alongside the sound and lighting crew to ensure none of the partygoers got too close to the event workers.

Leong recalled a moment there where he had to go beyond his usual call of duty to help someone in need.

"I had to tend to a Caucasian man who suffered a broken nose after an unfortunate incident," he said.

"With the situational training I had been given at SII as well as prior first aid knowledge, I gave immediate first aid to stop the bleeding on his nose."

Apart from handling immediate situations, Leong also had good memories from his involvement in these events.

"The event company boss praised us for a job well done in ensuring the workers did their job without any distraction after ZoukOut," he added.

"During the YOG, I had enjoyable talks with young athletes and officials while tourists praised us for going beyond our duties to help them with their enquiries."

Finally, Leong has something to say about the perception of security jobs for young people. Security is for all who can contribute to make Singapore a safer place for all to work and have fun.


