WHAT IS GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)?

Each grade is assigned a fixed number of points, called the subject **Grade Points**. In addition, each subject is worth a specific number of **Credit Units**. The GPA is calculated using the formula:

Sum of (Grade Points X Credit Units)
Sum of (all Credit Units)

The cumulative GPA (or cGPA) considers all the subjects taken so far.
